

Halloween CAC - Hat

**About**

A fun and fast Halloween blanket created over 19 squares, joined with a black border and edged with a triple colour border.

The blanket is a simple and modern design constructed using C2C (corner to corner) crochet. The blanket can be made in either treble crochet or a mini version using Half Treble Crochet.

Blocks are released twice weekly in the run up to halloween 2016 on Mondays and Thursdays.

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You Will Need:

Hook Size: 4mm

Yarns Used: One ball 100g of double knit in each of the 5 colours black, dark grey, grey, light grey and white

Gauge: After blocking, in pattern: the completed block is approximately 10.5" square

Other Notions: Tapestry needle

Final Measurements: The treble crochet sized blanket is approximately 82" by 82"

Stitch Abbreviations

dc - double crochet

tc - treble crochet

htc - half treble crochet

ss - slip stitch

ch - chain

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Hat Right

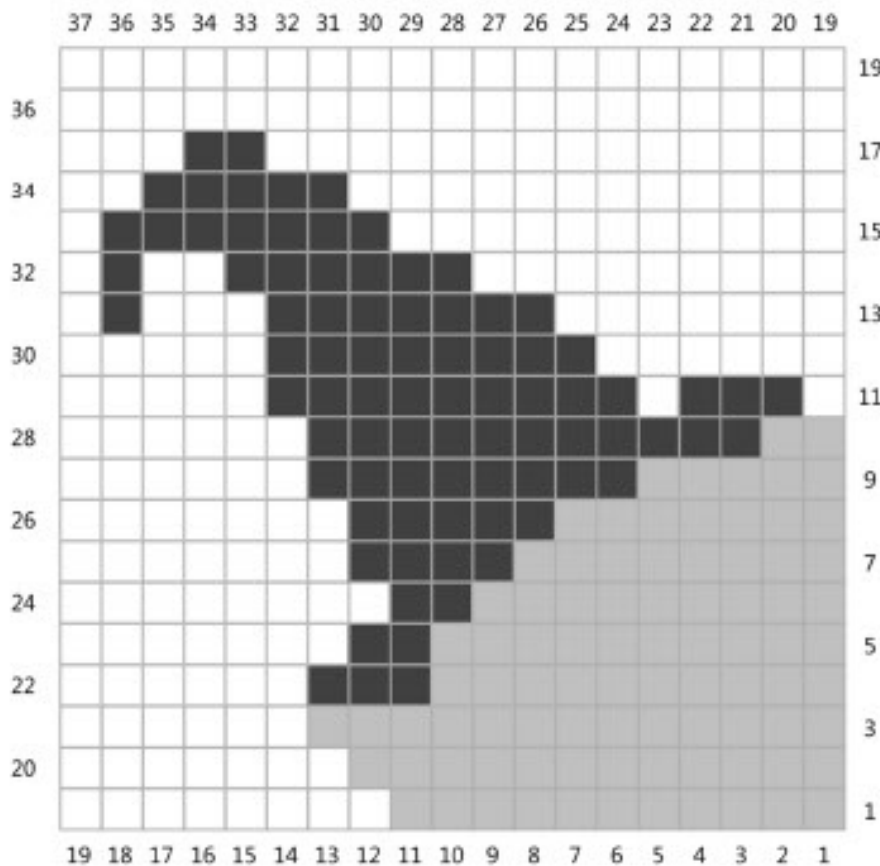
Yarn Colours: W - white, LG – light grey, DG – dark grey

Pattern:

- Row 1: 1LG (1 block)
- Row 2: 2LG (2 blocks)
- Row 3: 3LG (3 blocks)
- Row 4: 4LG (4 blocks)
- Row 5: 5LG (5 blocks)
- Row 6: 6LG (6 blocks)
- Row 7: 7LG (7 blocks)
- Row 8: 8LG (8 blocks)
- Row 9: 1W, 8LG (9 blocks)
- Row 10: 6LG, 1DG, 2LG, 1W (10 blocks)
- Row 11: 2W, 1LG, 1DG, 7LG (11 blocks)
- Row 12: 7LG, 2DG, 1LG, 2W (12 blocks)
- Row 13: 3W, 1LG, 1DG, 8LG (13 blocks)
- Row 14: 1LG, 1DG, 5LG, 2DG, 2LG, 3W (14 blocks)
- Row 15: 4W, 1LG, 4DG, 4LG, 1DG, 1W (15 blocks)
- Row 16: 1W, 1DG, 3LG, 5DG, 2LG, 4W (16 blocks)
- Row 17: 5W, 1LG, 6DG, 2LG, 1DG, 2W (17 blocks)
- Row 18: 2W, 9DG, 2LG, 5W (18 blocks)
- Row 19: 6W, 1LG, 9DG, 3W (19 blocks)
- *Row 20: 2W, 9DG, 2LG, 5W (18 blocks)
- Row 21: 5W, 1LG, 9DG, 2W (17 blocks)
- Row 22: 3W, 8DG, 1LG, 4W (16 blocks)
- Row 23: 4W, 1LG, 5DG, 5W (15 blocks)
- Row 24: 6W, 4DG, 1LG, 3W (14 blocks)
- Row 25: 3W, 1DG, 9W (13 blocks)
- Row 26: 8W, 2DG, 2W (12 blocks)
- Row 27: 2W, 1DG, 8W (11 blocks)
- Row 28: 8W, 1DG, 1W (10 blocks)
- Row 29: 9W (9 blocks)
- Row 30: 8W (8 blocks)
- Row 31: 7W (7 blocks)
- Row 32: 6W (6 blocks)
- Row 33: 5W (5 blocks)
- Row 34: 4W (4 blocks)
- Row 35: 3W (3 blocks)
- Row 36: 2W (2 blocks)
- Row 37: 1W (1 block)

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Hat Left Pattern Chart



Colours:

W - White

G - Grey

DG - Dark Grey

Black border of DC

Odd rows bottom to top

Even rows top to bottom

Start in the bottom right and work up to the top left.

Once the square has been completed the border can be added using Black in DC. Chain 2 in the corners with 2DC in each block with a single DC between blocks.

I suggest marking the front with stitch marker to keep all tails and joins behind the block.

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Hat Left

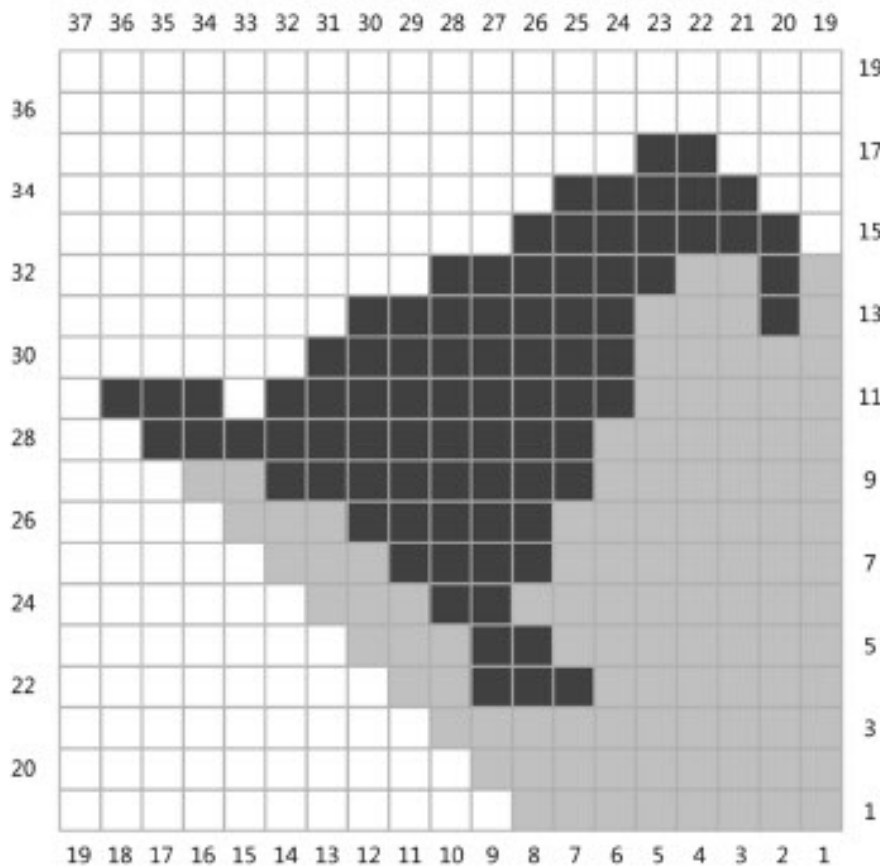
Yarn Colours: W - white, LG – light grey, DG – dark grey

Pattern:

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 Row 4: 4LG (4 blocks)
 Row 5: 5LG (5 blocks)
 Row 6: 6LG (6 blocks)
 Row 7: 7LG (7 blocks)
 Row 8: 8LG (8 blocks)
 Row 9: 9LG (9 blocks)
 Row 10: 10LG (10 blocks)
 Row 11: 10LG, 1W (11 blocks)
 Row 12: 1W, 2DG, 8LG, 1W (12 blocks)
 Row 13: 1W, 8LG, 2DG, 2W (13 blocks)
 Row 14: 3W, 3DG, 4LG, 1DG, 1LG, 2W (14 blocks)
 Row 15: 2W, 1LG, 7DG, 5W (15 blocks)
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 Row 29: 4W, 2DG, 3W (9 blocks)
 Row 30: 3W, 2DG, 1W, 1DG, 1W (8 blocks)
 Row 31: 1W, 4DG, 2W (7 blocks)
 Row 32: 2W, 3DG, 1W (6 blocks)
 Row 33: 5W (5 blocks)
 Row 34: 4W (4 blocks)
 Row 35: 3W (3 blocks)
 Row 36: 2W (2 blocks)
 Row 37: 1W (1 block)

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Hat Right Pattern Chart



Colours:

W - White

G - Grey

DG - Dark Grey

Black border of DC

Odd rows bottom to top

Even rows top to bottom

Start in the bottom right and work up to the top left.

Once the square has been completed the border can be added using Black in DC. Chain 2 in the corners with 2DC in each block with a single DC between blocks.
